Hurricane Irma Impact on Saint Martin

Dear Streamlines Customers,

First and foremost, our thoughts are with all who have been and will be affected by Hurricane Irma - one of the most intense category 5 hurricanes ever recorded in the Atlantic area.

Irma devastated Saint Martin on Wednesday 6 September, destroying homes, hotels, stores and transportation networks, including the port infrastructure. At this moment, there is no clear indication when the Philipsburg terminal could be back up and running. Consequently, all cargo destined for Saint Martin in the near term future will have to be diverted to Point-a-Pitre, Guadeloupe, where it will be transshipped to Philipsburg at the earliest time possible. Costs related to this transshipment in Guadeloupe, including extra storage days, will be absorbed by StreamLines.

All cargo on the AS Fortuna destined for Phillipsburg with an ETA of 13 September will be discharged in Guadeloupe. If restoration of port infrastructure is achieved the week after, the following week's sailing of AS Fabiana will reload all transshipped Phillipsburg cargo from Guadeloupe on 20 September, and discharge in Phillipsburg on 21 September.

We will keep all communication channels open to provide our customers, agents and stakeholders with up to date information regarding the Hurricane's impact across the Atlantic.
